

WILDLIFE, FISH AND RECREATION
DOG CONTROL PLAN

Per our discussion on May 5, 2021, concerning the Wildlife, Fish and Recreations (WFR) plan for dog control in the community.

The Conservation Officers, Tim Feliciano and Dalton Grassel, will live trap dogs/cats running at large in the communities of Lower Brule and West Brule and will be humanely terminated or given to the nearest animal rescue organization on Monday's from 7:00 am - 12:00 am.

Every day the Conservation Officers will be on the look out to terminate stray dogs running at large/outside the communities.

The WFR currently fields dog complaint calls at the WFR office from 8:00 am through 4:30 pm M-F and forward the calls to the Conservation Officer(s) on duty for investigation.

From 6:30 pm – 7:00 am M-F the WFR does not have any Conservation Officers on duty. In conversation with Mr. House, BIA Police Chief, he informed me that he would get us a incident report the next morning, if there was a dog incident between said hours, so that we can follow up on incident.

The WFR has been organizing a free veterinarian clinic to the community on a yearly basis or when they are available to spay and neuter dogs and cats. It costs us approximately \$5000 to set these services up.
